**Alleged Libellous Notice by Bookseller.**

Fifty pounds damages were awarded by Mr. Justice Bennett in the Chancery Division, yesterday, in an action brought by Mr. Edward Alexander Crowley against Mr. Arthur Gordon Gray, a bookseller, of Fraed Street, Paddington, alleging libel contained in a notice attached to Mr. Crowley's novel "Moonchild," exposed for sale at Mr. Gray's shop.

His Lordship awarded damages to the amount stated, with costs, and granted a stay of execution with a view to an appeal, if the amount of the damages were brought into court.
