## IN COURT ON CHARGE OF RECEIVING LETTERS

Only evidence of arrest was given at Marylebone yesterday when Edward Alexander Crowley, an author, known as Aleister Crowley, aged 58, of Upper Montagu-street, W., was remanded on bail of  $\pounds 10$  for six days charged with feloniously receiving five letters, the property of Betty Sedgwick.

- Mr. E. F. Iwi, prosecuting, said the letters were in the custody of the Crown Office, and application would have to be made in the High Court for them to be produced before the magazine.
- Mr. I. Kerman, for the defence, said that Crowley had a complete answer to the charge.

Mr. Snell: There is another man connected with the case.

Detective-Sergeant Davidson: So far I have been unable to trace him, but I have hopes of doing so in the very near future.
