ALEISTER CROWLEY TO APPEAL

Edward Alexander Crowley (Aleister Crowley, the author), to-day stated that he had signed notice of appeal against his Old Bailey conviction.

Mr. Crowley was found of receiving four original letters and one copy of a letter alleged to have been stolen from Mrs. Betty Sedgwick, an artist's model professionally known as "Betty May." The letters were stated to have been produced during an action for damages for alleged libel brought by Mr. Crowley against a firm of publishers respecting a passage in a book

Judge Whiteley, K.C., bound Mr. Crowley over for two years, and ordered him to pay a sum not exceeding 50 guineas, towards the costs of the prosecution.
