Mr. E. Parks, Senior Official Receiver, reported that the debtor had stated the he was commonly known as Aleister Crowley; he was also a psychiatrist. He roughly estimated his liabilities at £5,000, and did not admit insolvency, his present position being due to his inability to earn money owing to damage to his reputation arising out of a lawsuit. The assets constitute a large claim in a pending action against a person now said to be in Shanghai.

The case was left in the hands of the Official Receiver.
