**"Worst Man In The World" Dies,
Leaves Weird Pictures.**

LONDON—Weird paintings of what seem to be totem poles are hanging in the boarding house where Aleister Crowley, 72, sensational dabbler in magic in the nineteen-twenties died suddenly.

A fellow boarder at Hastings, Sussex said:

No one can guess what the paintings mean.

"They look like Peruvian totem poles with queer faces and grotesque shapes."

Twenty-five years ago Crowley self-styled "The Beast 666" was accused of presiding at disgusting orgies under the cover of a "free love" cult.

His autobiographical series was entitled "They Have Called Me the Worst Man in the World."
