Aleister Crowley's famous masterpiece "MAGICK IN THEORY AND PRACTICE" has often been reproached with being too technical, too condensed, too learned?, high? It presupposes general and magical knowledge which many do not possess. It is not a book for beginners. Readers and serious students continued writing to him asking for further elucidation on many subjects, in such a way that it could be understood by the average mind. The correspondents were from many parts of the world and from different levels of general knowledge and education.

The answers which form the 83 Chapters composing the present book, mirror this fluctuation clearly. The correspondence lasted practically until the author's death. (December 1947) Out of his mature knowledge, experience and wisdom, Aleister Crowley discourses on not only mystical, magical and occult subjects, but also matters of practical everyday life. Some chapters bring information nowhere else stated by Crowley before in his writings. In others he penetrates most obscure problems of philosophy. Then again he intersperses the narrative with amusing and fascinating anecdotes based on personal experience.

The whole is now presented for the first time to the public in a handsomely bound volume. The book should be invaluable to the seeker for wisdom, and to all who are puzzled by the complexities of modern life.
