Introduction to Physiological Psychology. By Dr. Theodor Ziehen. Swan Sonnenschein and Co., 6s.

This admirable manual of Physiological Psychology cannot fail to be of great interest to every psychologist who cares for the physiological side of his fascinating science. At the same time, it should, we think, never be forgotten that the study of physiological psychology is hardly complete without a parallel research in psychological physiology.

Nor should confusion arise between physiology proper, psychology proper, and psycho-physiology; while for the physio-psychologist it is important to assimilate and coordinate the data of epistemology and embryology with those of ontogeny and phylogeny, for the psychophysiologist it is sufficient to rest in that monistic autokineticism which is only distinguishable from blank atheism by its Hellenistic-Teutonic terminology.
