Hitherto I have fought shy of a label, for I am at least as much a mystic as a sceptic; but for the purposes of this argument I pray you to honor me with the title of Atheist. If we should ever quarrel on the point, it will at least be not until the mangy lion of Ecclesiasticism and the jackals of Nonconformity have finally ceased to show their fangs, crimsoned with the blood of a great company of Atheist heroes and martyrs, physically overcome, spiritually invulnerable.
